Five to six hundred people attended, and 63.6% of them made purchases. Next year the show will be in the Merriam Community Center, a much more cost-efficient venue.

KAWS: Cindy Lessenden

KAWS biennial conference will be held this year on October 9-11 in Manhattan at Pottorf Hall on the Riley County fairgrounds.

Discussion: KAWS is held on alternating years with the Midwest Weaver's Association. The next MWA conference will be in 2027. It would be good if Kansas City could host the 2029 conference. To this end, Sylvia has spoken to the presidents of guilds in Manhattan, Topeka and Lawrence and other active fiber groups about cooperating in hosting the event with our guild taking the lead in coordination. The Yarn Barn's Susan Bateman is willing to be the vendor coordinator for the event. The board will discuss this after the February meeting.
