At our January meeting, we voted in favor of adopting <u>reStart</u> as our community service project. I am thrilled that we will work as a group to ease homelessness in the area. Recently, I spoke with Daisha Kimbrough, Volunteer Coordinator at



reStart, and there are a wide variety of activities in which we can participate over the next year. I will work on summarizing those opportunities and communicate them soon. The Guild is registered as a reStart volunteer organization, and this designation provides a way to collectively track our volunteer efforts. We're off to a good start. In January, we donated 195 cotton crocheted washcloths (pictured left).

#### Support in February

We can participate in their February blanket and towel drive. They will accept new or gently used blankets and/or towels for distribution to individuals and families. This is an easy way to continue our support of

the homeless by giving the gift of warmth during these cold months.
