Here are the measurements for the Guild Library shelves

"Celebrating Fiber Art"

In celebration of 50 years, the members of the Kansas City Fiber Guild will be displaying and selling their hand-made textile artwork at Images Art Gallery September 19 - October 11, 2025. Images Art Gallery is located in Downtown Overland Park at 7320 West 80th Street. The gallery hours are Wednesday - Saturday 10-6.

At the gallery along with the marvelous display of handmade textile arts, there is a nice history display of Fiber Guild activities over the last 50 years. The display is a nice chance to reminisce about how young we all were way back then!

Please stop by the gallery and enjoy the display of textile arts. All pieces in the

show are made by participating guild members using various fiber arts techniques like Hand Weaving, Hand Knitting, Hand Spinning, Hand Dyeing, and Hand Felting. There are 21 individual participating artists as well as pieces from two study groups.

The FELTING STUDY GROUP has a collaborative piece titled "Flint Hills Landscape in Felt" on display at the show. 12 individual guild member artists each provided a section of a Flint Hills photograph interpreted in felt. When all 12 felted interpretations were complete, the 12 sections were assembled into a collaborative art piece. The piece is really stunning to look at!

The WOOL STUDY GROUP has a collaborative piece titled "Study in Barlycorn Scarf" on display at the show. 6 individual guild member artists participated in a timed "Sheep-To-Shawl" contest to produce this scarf. The team had 5 spinners who prepped the freshly shorn fleece and hand spun the yarn for the project and one weaver who wove the hand spun wool to make the scarf. The team completed their work in a 5-hour time frame.
