Weavers Guild of Greater Kansas City Educational Scholarship

Beginners as well as advanced fiber artists may apply. Financial need is not a consideration.

Amount of award: Will depend on Guild funds and cannot exceed the cost of the workshop.

Purpose: To enrich the applicant's personal growth in the fiber field, as well as cultivate the Guild community and knowledge of the fiber arts.

Eligibility: Guild members who have been a member for at least one year and have attended at least two meetings in the last six months.

Deadline for submission: See Guideline number six(6).

Guidelines:

- 1. Qualifying courses include day and multi-day workshops. Applications must be accompanied by a brochure or other appropriate material describing the event.
- 2. Application form may be obtained from the Scholarship Committee Chairperson (or printed from the Guild Website). The application must be typed, computer generated or legibly printed. Neatness counts. Committee must be able to read what you present.
- 3. If the event for which the scholarship money was received is cancelled, the recipient must return the money to the Guild as soon as possible or no later than 60 days after cancellation.
- 4. Recipient is required to give Guild program within one year after the completion of the study. (In rare cases the program may be scheduled after one year has elapsed in order to meet the needs of the Guild Program Schedule.) The Guild program, lasting (at least 45 minutes) is to be on what the recipient learned. Program will be in the form of a (lecture or hands-on) following a regular Guild meeting. Recipients of \$250.00 or more required to give a one day workshop as well as a Guild presentation. All presentations should include a handout.
- 5. Previous award recipients who received more than \$250.00 may re-apply for another scholarship after an *18-month period* from date they give their Guild program and workshop. Recipients who received less than \$250.00 may re-apply for another scholarship after a *12-month period* from the date they gave their Guild program.
- 6. It is important you get your application to the Scholarship Committee as soon as possible. Applications are reviewed by the Scholarship Committee and forward their recommendation to the Guild Board for final approval. Proposals not accepted during any given year may be re-submitted the following year.

Weavers Guild of Greater Kansas City Educational Scholarship Application

Scholarship recipients are required to present a program lasting at least 45 minutes (and possibly a one day workshop, depending on the award amount) to the Weavers Guild of Greater Kansas City within **one** year (or as soon thereafter as the Guild schedule allows) of completion of the study. The presentation(s) should be arranged through the Guild Program Chair*. The objective of the presentation is to teach what the recipient learned in the course of study.

*It is your responsibility to contact the Guild Program Chair to setup your program(s).
